

As one of the initiatives to enhance the appeal and educational value of the botanical garden, the Save Rani Bagh Botanical Garden Foundation was instrumental in establishing a butterfly garden in one of Rani Bagh's many large internal gardens in the March 2018. We planted over 40 larval host plants and nectar-rich plants and installed two general information plaques at the entrance and 40 small plaques near respective plants. One of the plaques gives basic details on how to set up a butterfly garden in one's neighbourhood or even a balcony.
